Max Goodman and Nigel Forbes have a long-standing collaboration, but despite some early success, their creative partnership is in stagnation and they are close to financial ruin. As they desperately seek inspiration for a hit, Nigel's vindictive wife Ann enters the fray, and the men soon realise she represents the perfect victim for their play. As they plan the intricacies of the 'murder' in increasing detail, the boundaries between fiction and reality soon become somewhat blurred. As Max and Nigel draw on all of their experience to plot the perfect murder, they must contend with the watchful eye of a local police inspector (who just happens to be an amateur dramatic and an avid fan of their work), as well as keeping it secret from their sassy secretary Jill. A piece from "Shock" was chosen for a festival held at Crewe theatre, and "Edge of Darkness" certainly kept our audiences on the edge of their seats. For this play Brian Clemens has collaborated with Dennis Spooner.

About The Writers

Brian Clemens was born in 1931, and is probably best known for his work on the hit television series 'The Avengers'. He wrote the original pilot episode in 1961, and was the main scriptwriter for the series (as well as co-producing). His production company went on to produce the series 'The Professionals', and Clemens also wrote for series such as 'Bergerac' and, more recently, the hit BBC drama 'Bugs'.

Dennis Spooner was born in 1932, and is best known for his work in children's television, script writing for the likes of 'Thunderbirds', 'Stingray', and 'Fireball XL5'. He was also a major contributor to the formative William Hartnell era of 'Doctor Who'. In later years he collaborated with Clemens on 'The Professionals' and 'Bergerac', as well as 'The New Avengers'. Spooner passed away on 20th September 1986.
